

Salzburg

Over shadowed by one of the largest castles in Europe, the Hohensalzburg Fortress, Salzburg is renowned as the birthplace of Mozart and for having one of the best preserved city centres in the world. The old part of the city was made a UNESCO site in 1997 and is a wonderful place to wander and immerse yourself in the striking examples of baroque architecture. Other architectural highlights are the Mirabell Palace and Gardens where scenes from the Sound of Music were filmed and the Wasserspiele Hellbrunn, an Archbishop's Palace and water garden that is a fine place to spend a warm summer's day.

St Peters Abbey has been providing sanctuary for the Benedictine monks for over 1000 years. Redesigned in 1756 to incorporate an 'onion dome' the interior was lavishly painted and decorated in the Rococo style in the following years. If you feel like escaping the city for the day, take the cable car up the Untersburg mountain to be rewarded with far reaching views across the alpine landscape. Alternatively, walk to the top and treat yourself in the restaurant at the top.

The Salzburg Card

The most important card for your visit to Salzburg, the Salzburg Card is your key to the city of Salzburg: it provides free admission to the city's museums, free use of the Fortress funicular, the Untersberg cableway, Salzach ship service and public transport.

Mozart's birthplace

Born on January 27th 1756, in this modest house in Salzburg, Mozart's surroundings in later life proved to be very opulent in comparison. Now one of the most frequently visited museums in the world, this informative exhibition spread over three floors will reveal the details of his life and how a gifted child became one of the most significant composers in the world.
