

France, Carcassonne

Due to the dramatic natural landscape and strategic location, the area where Carcassonne now stands has, since 3500 BC had a settlement here next to the River Aude. A visual architectural history from its occupation by the Romans in 100 BC to the present day is reflected in its fortified walls, Gothic Cathedral and Mediaeval houses.

The fortified part of the city grew over the centuries with each successive ruler adding their own structures until the 14th century. In 1849 the city had fallen into such a state of disrepair a demolition order was placed on it. This created uproar from the locals, and as a result the castle underwent a period of renovation overseen by the famous Architect Eugene Viollet-le-Duc who was already at work restoring the 6th century Basillica of Saint-Nazaire. Now a UNESCO Heritage site and hugely popular with tourists, the city and surrounding lands have many other attractions to offer the visitor, and are in close proximity to both the Mediterranean coastline and the mountains of the Pyrenees.

A perfect area to combine both beach and inland activities, outstanding cuisine and beautiful landscapes, the Languedoc-Roussillon area is well worth exploring.





Places to visit

Cathar Castles

With 24 sites, you will struggle to visit them all in one trip, but the rewarding views from the sometimes remote locations of these ruined castles, make a visit to at least a few worthwhile. Some of the castles are large and popular (Queribus & Peyrepertu) some spectacularly inaccessible but worth it (Montsegur) and some in town centre locations (Foix). Buy a passport at the first location and this will give you a discount for the other 23.

Lac Cavayare (Carcassonne Plage)

This beautiful lake surrounded by woodland has both pebble and sand beaches and is a one stop entertainment destination for adults and children alike. Parking and entrance to the lake for swimming is free and lakeside stalls provide various food options. Aside from this there is a water based inflatable assault course, boating, archery, zip lines and numerous other activities on offer

Pyrene Rafting

Crystal clear water, beautiful landscapes and adrenalin charged rafting with knowledgeable instructors. Choose your method of decent through the wild waters of the Gorge de L'Aude and you are guaranteed an afternoon or full day of fun. Everything is supplied, just bring your bathing suit and a towel.
