

France, Dijon

Dijon is an architecturally rich city and the centre has some remarkable buildings dating from between the 12th and 15th centuries. Fortunately they have remained more or less untouched by the effects of war, even though the city has been occupied by everyone from the Prussians and Swiss to the Germans in the Second World War.

Positioned on a plain, Dijon lies on the banks of the river Ouche with the cote (hills) that give the area its name to the south. 198 miles to the north is Paris and Lyon is equidistant to the south. The area is notable for its mustard, created in 1856 when juice from unripe grapes was substituted for vinegar by Jean Naigeon, its local vineyards, where some of the world's most expensive wines are produced and crème de cassis, a local blackcurrant liqueur that is added to white wine to produce the drink 'Kir'.

The city has numerous fantastic museums, including the Musée des Beaux-Arts de Dijon, one of the oldest in France. Housed in the Palace of the Duke of Burgundy, the world renowned collections include an encyclopaedic collection that references everything from Egyptian art to the 20th century. Dijon holds an International and Gastronomic Fair every year in autumn. With over 500 exhibitors and 200,000 visitors every year, it is one of the ten most important fairs in France.





Places to visit

Les Caves de L'Abbave

Enjoy a 2 hour tour, hosted by Guillaume and learn about the Burgundy wines and the history of the local vineyards. Finish with some food and wine tasting in the beautiful surroundings of the cave bar. If you are fortunate enough to be there in the evening, they often have Jazz musicians providing the soundtrack. L' Abbaye de Fontenay

The Abbey of Fontenay was founded by Saint Bernard in 1118 and is one of the oldest Cistercian Abbeys in the world. The Romanesque architecture has remained remarkably intact since the Middle Ages. The old Abbey of Fontenay (12th century) was one of the first monuments to be inscribed on the Unesco world heritage list.
