

Germany, The Romantic Road

Nature, culture and hospitality are the three hallmarks of the Romantic Road. This 220 mile route from Wuzburg in North Baveria to Fussen in the Austrian Alps offers excitement for art lovers, festival goers, history buffs and everyone who likes a celebration. It will take you to historic towns with striking buildings and historical sites that have lost none of their original charm.

Jewels come in swift succession, be it magnificent stately homes, palaces of courtly splendour or medieval timber-framed architecture. This route leads through the Liebliches Taubertal region and the Nördlinger Ries, situated in the heart of a giant crater.

Visit picturesque Lechfeld plain and Pfaffenwinkel in the foothills of the Upper Bavarian Alps before finally ending up at King Ludwig's famous fairytale castles. The very name 'Romantic Road' expresses how many visitors from Germany and from abroad feel when they first feast their eyes on this spectacular backdrop of riches, western history, art and culture.

The Romantic Road is also Germany's festival road: from May until well into autumn, it fizzes with historical festivals offering fresh air, entertainment, delectable food and tangy beer. Alternatively you can discover the magic of this dream route on foot or by bike.





Places to visit

Castle Neuschwanstein

One of the most recognisable castles in Germany and the inspiration for the Sleeping Beauty castle at Disneyland. This Romanesque masterpiece has towered above the village of Hohenschwangau since 1880. The concept was drafted by the stage designer Christian Jank but ultimately it was Ludwig who designed and financed the project, finally moving in after 15 years of construction in 1884, he was resident there for 172 days.

Wurzburg

Watched over by the Marienburg Fortress, this University City on the River Main is surrounded by vineyards. In addition to the UNESCO protected Prince Bishop's Palace, the Baroque masterpiece by Balthasar Neumann, the city also has the Cathedral, St Mary's Chapel and the old bridge over the River Main to explore. There are numerous museums and theatres to visit, and during the summer month's some excellent festivals

Rothenburg ob der Tauber

A beautiful town perched on a hill top and surrounded by medieval walls. Walking around the wall takes about an hour, with the reward being breathtaking views out to the vineyards and surrounding valleys. The town is full of beautifully preserved medieval architecture, cosy shops, restaurants and cafes. In the evening there are a choice of moonlit street tours which will inform you of the history of this historic gem.
