

The city of Barcelona is located in the north east of the Iberian Peninsula on the shores of the Mediterranean, and is the capital of the once independent Catalan region of Spain. 75km to the north are the foothills of the Pyrenees and beyond the Languedoc region of France.

The city has had a chequered past and control has changed hands several times since it was first founded by the Romans. In its early history it was rules by the Visigoths, the Arabs and the counts of Catalonia, and after the fall of the city to Franco's coup de Etat in 1939, the local Catalonian language was suppressed and the autonomous regions abolished.

Renowned for its exciting architecture, most famously its medieval quarter and buildings created in the Art Nouveau period by Antoni Gaudi. Barcelona is also home to the Barcelona pavillion designed by Mies van der Rohe for the International Exposition of 1929.

Barcelona has in recent years been leading the way in world class cuisine and chefs in the city have been giving the traditional Catalan flavours a modern twist, utilizing the delicious and varied local produce.





Places to visit

Basilica De La Sagrada Familia

A Roman Catholic Basilica of grand proportions designed by Antoni Gaudi when he took over the project in 1882. At the time of his death in it was less than a quarter finished and the completion date is now pencilled in for 2026, 100 years after his death. It has been called 'the most extraordinary personal interpretation of Gothic architecture since the Middle Ages.

Catalan Food

The Sentits restaurant is leading the way with chef Jordi Artal bringing a new spin to the traditional Catalan recipes. Finally receiving a Michelin star it remains one of the more affordable top end places to indulge yourself in gastronomic heaven.
